

How it was


The incident at the Chernobyl nuclear power plant on April 26, 1986 - the destruction of the fourth power unit of the Chernobyl nuclear power plant, located near the city of Pripyat, the destruction was explosive, the reactor was completely destroyed, and a large amount of radioactive substances were released into the environment.

Risks after people realized that the explosion at Chernobyl, they started to evacuate the area with the evacuation of Pripyat's 47,000 residents over 3-5 weeks, only 1,000 homes from Kiev. Residents, however, had very little time to pack, so they were in a hurry, but, mostly by surviving.


Results are important, but so is process.

The IGCSE provides the most rigorous and adaptable option to bridge the highly-articulated curricula used in our elementary and middle schools and the International Baccalaureate Diploma Program (IBDP)*. We intentionally designed course offerings to help our students reach their potential while preparing them for the challenges of the IB offered in eleventh and twelfth grades, alongside a TASIS Diploma path based on American standards.

Beyond the IGCSE, academic enrichment classes continue throughout high school, as do a range of elective options designed to enhance and support academic achievement while providing alternative creative outlets.



PERFORMING ARTS

Drama students develop an understanding and enjoyment of the discipline. Through practical and theoretical study, they develop group/individual skills to communicate ideas, emotion, and story to an audience.

FINE ARTS

The Art & Design Program encourages self expression by stimulating imagination, sensitivity, conceptual thinking, powers of observation, and analytical ability.

Learners gain confidence and enthusiasm for beauty as they develop technical skills in two- and three-dimensional form and composition.



DANCE ACADEMY

The TASIS Portugal Dance Academy encourages an appreciation of dance and, for those interested, a path to post-secondary study or vocational training to choreograph a career in the art of dance.

Students have the opportunity to take classes in ballet, jazz, and lyrical styles. Classes are taught by trained and exceptionally-qualified TASIS Portugal teachers who have had successful dance careers.

TASIS Speaks



